PM calls for harmony in violence-torn Manipur

Modi stresses need for dialogue between hill, valley districts during his first visit since violence erupted

He inaugurates projects worth ₹7,300 crore across Imphal and Churachandpur districts

He meets internally displaced people, pledging assistance and construction of 7,000 homes

n his first visit to Manipur since ethnic violence erupt-ed over two years ago, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday called for strengthening dialogue to build a strong bridge of harmony between hill and valley districts.

The ethnic conflict that broke out in May 2023 is between the Meitei people, who dominate the Imphal valley, and the Kuki-Zo people, who dominate the surrounding hills.

After flying into Imphal airport from Aizawl in Mizoram, where he had inaugurated a railway project, Mr. Modi headed by road to the hill district of Churachandpur. Establishing peace is essential for devechandpur. lopment anywhere, he said, after inaugurating projects worth ₹7,300 crore and meeting internally displaced people.

On his return from the dressed a gathering at Kangla Fort in Imphal city, 61 km from Churachandpur. He inaugurated projects worth ₹1,200 crore at Imphal.

Rain hits schedule

Incessant rain forced lastminute changes in the Prime Minister's schedule security arrange and security arrange-ments. Though he was ori-ginally slated to travel by helicopter directly from Ai zawl to Churachandpur be fore flying to Imphal, Mr Modi was forced to travel by road from the State capital. The planned road-show in Churachandpur had to be curtailed.

Buffer zones guarded by central security forces have been carved out bet-ween the State's Meitei and Kuki-Zo dominated areas. Travelling through one such buffer zone between Bishnupur and Chura-chandpur, Mr. Modi's motorcade crossed a damaged

"Manipur is a land of hope and promise. Unfor tunately, violence had gripped this magnificent area. A little while ago, I met the affected people who are living in camps After speaking with them, I

can say that a new dawn of hope and confidence awaiting Manipur," Mr. Modi said in Churachandpur.

He said the Union government would continue to cooperate with the State government to help reset-tle displaced people in appropriate locations as soon as possible, and to esta-blish peace.

Manipur has been under President's Rule since February 13.

"I am pleased that re-cently dialogues have begun with different groups in the hills and valleys for reaching agreements. These efforts are part of the Government of Bharat's commitment to establishing peace through dia logue, respect, and mutual understanding. I urge all organisations to move forward on the path of peace, fulfil their dreams, and se cure the future of their children," Mr. Modi said.

EC claims 'exclusive' power to decide on holding SIR

The Election Commission (EC) has, in no uncertain terms, told the Supreme Court to leave alone its "exclusive jurisdiction" to decide when and how to conduct special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls.

The commission was responding to a petition seeking a judicial direction from the top court to the panel to conduct SIR at "regular intervals" throughout the country to identify and expel foreign infiltrators enrolled as Indian voters.

EC's call

The commission said its power to decide if a revisional exercise would be intensive or summary would "depend on the situation".

The call was entirely its own and outside the judicial ambit.

"The decision to conduct a summary or an intensive revision of the electoral roll is left to the discretion of the ECI. The ECI has complete discretion over the policy of revision to the exclusion of any other authority," it submitted.

Provisions of the Representation of the People Act, 1950 and the Registration of Electoral Rules, 1960 gave the commission

the timing of the revisional exercise".

"The obligation to conduct a revision of the electoral roll is not couched within a timeline," the EC noted. The poll body said the law allowed it power to hold a special revision of the electoral roll of any constituency or part of it "in such a manner as it may think fit".

'Periodic SIR necessary'

The petitioner, Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay, said periodic SIR before every general, State and local body elections was necessary to protect the purity of the electoral process. But the poll panel would brook no interference from the courts.

"A direction to conduct SIR at 'regular intervals' throughout the country would encroach the exclusive jurisdiction of the Election Commission," the poll body said.

The exchange has come in the middle of an ongoing dispute over the Bihar SIR ers, including Opposition political parties, have claimed to be "citizenship screening" in the guise of a revisional exercise of the State's electoral roll.

'Fully cognisant'

The poll body assured that it was "fully cognisant of its statutory duty to maintain the purity and integrity of the electoral rolls".

The EC confirmed there would be a nationwide SIR with January 1, 2026 as the qualifying date.

"There is a letter of July 5 to all Chief Electoral Officers (CEOs) of States and UTs to initiate immediate pre-revision activities for the SIR of electoral rolls with reference to January 1, 2026 as the qualifying date on a nationwide basis," the EC informed the court.

The poll body said it had convened a conference of all the CEOs of the States and Union Territories in New Delhi on September 10 to "further strengthen and coordinate preparatory measures for conduct-

Election Commission claims 'exclusive' power on Special Intensive Revision (SIR) English:

The Election Commission told the Supreme Court it has sole discretion to decide when and how to conduct intensive revision of electoral rolls. It rejected petitions seeking court-mandated periodic SIR, saying such directions would encroach upon EC's constitutional authority. The EC confirmed a nationwide SIR with January 1, 2026 as qualifying date.

Impose tariffs on Russian oil buyers, U.S. tells G7

NEW YORK/WASHINGTON

The U.S. has asked G7 members to impose tariffs on countries purchasing oil from Russia, asserting that only "unified efforts" that cut off funding to Moscow's war machine at source can apply sufficient pressure to end "the senseless killing" in Ukraine.

Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and the U.S. Trade Representative, Jamieson Greer, were on a call with G7 Finance Ministers on Friday when they

reiterated President Donald Trump's call to the bloc's partners about imposing tariffs on countries purchasing oil from Russia. G7 is an intergovernmental bloc of rich, indus-

trialised countries com-

prising the U.S., Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, and the U.K.

Meanwhile, Mr. Trump said he was ready to sanction Moscow, but on the condition that all NATO allies agree to completely halt purchases of Russian oil and implement their own sanctions.

He also suggested members of the transatlantic alliance consider slapping tariffs of 50% to 100% on China as a way to help end Russia's war in Ukraine.

The U.S. has imposed 50% tariffs on Indian goods, including a 25% ad-

ditional duty for India's purchase of Russian oil.

Mr. Trump branded NA-TO nations' purchase of Russian oil "shocking" and said it weakens their bargaining power over Moscow. "Anyway, I am ready to 'go' when you are. Just say when?" "I believe that (NATO sanctions on Russia), plus NATO, as a group, placing 50% to 100% TA-RIFFS ON CHINA, to be fully withdrawn after the WAR with Russia and Ukraine is ended, will also be of great help in ENDING this deadly, but RIDICU-LOUS, WAR," he added.

U.S. asks G7 to impose tariffs on Russian oil buyers English:

The U.S. urged G7 members to impose tariffs on countries buying Russian oil to cut Moscow's war funding. Former President Trump suggested NATO allies halt Russian oil imports and impose 50–100% tariffs on China. India faces 50% tariffs on its exports due to Russian oil purchases.

The 11th Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA), India region conference, which concluded here on Saturday, adopted a four-point resolution in order to increase people's trust in democratic institutions.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla told the media that presiding officers of 26 States participated in the three-day conference.

The resolutions passed by the CPA are aimed at increasing people's trust in democratic institutions, eliminating deadlock and

disruptions in both Houses of Parliament and State legislatures to ensure more time in discussing issues of public welfare, he said.

On frequent disruptions in Parliament and legislatures, he appealed to MPs and MLAs to raise issues of political interest outside the House to maintain dignity of the House.

A comprehensive database would be prepared on all important issues in legislatures to ensure better quality of debate and discussions in legislative institutions, said Mr. Birla. He said digital technology would be adopted in legislatures so that the proceedings of democratic institutions would be properly communicated to the people and the efficiency of legislative bodies improved.

Women's participation

Mr. Birla acknowledged the fact that a large proportion of the country's population is youth and women, and said legislatures should make necessary efforts to ensure their greater participation in democratic institutions.

Mehbooba urges Speaker to condemn AAP MLA's detention

Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister and Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) president Mehbooba Mufti on Saturday urged Assembly Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather to convene a special session to condemn the detention of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) legislator Mehraj Malik under the Public Safety Act (PSA). Meanwhile, the situation in Dodistrict. da which witnessed protests in support of Mr. Malik, is gradually returning to normal.

"I urge Hon'ble Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather to call a special Assembly session to condemn the PSA and arrest of MLA Mehraj Malik. A resolution can put pressure on the Union government to release Malik and protect all MLAs from future targeting. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah should extend legal aid to thousands of poor Kashmiris languishing in jails across India. They need it the most," Ms. Mufti said.

Describing the detention of the AAP MLA as "an attack on democratic values and institutions", she said, "The J&K government should have resolved the matter through legislative procedures rather than

placing an elected representative behind bars. Invoking PSA against an MLA is unacceptable."

She pressed for a joint resolution through the Assembly to be sent to Delhi. "Undermining democratic institutions by targeting elected leaders is sheer injustice," Ms. Mufti said.

Highlighting the plight of youth lodged in prisons in Tihar, Agra, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh, she said, "They need to be offered legal help."

Referring to the AAP's stand on the abrogation of Article 370 and the recent detention of AAP MP Sanjay Singh during his Kashmir visit, Ms. Mufti re-"Those marked. who supported the abrogation of Article 370 are now facing its consequences. The AAP voted for its removal in 2019, claiming it was good for J&K. Today it has realised the reality."

Mehbooba urges Speaker to condemn detention of AAP MLA under PSA English:

Most tourist spots in J&K have been reopened: Omar

J&K CM Omar Abdullah says one of the challenges that his government has taken upon itself is to try and improve the links between the States south of the Vindhyas and Jammu and Kashmir

ost tourist destinations in Jammu and Kashmir have reopened, and the government is taking all necessary precautions to encourage more people to visit for holidays and film shoots, J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said on Saturday.

Speaking to presspersons on the sidelines of an event organised in Chennai by the Good Deeds Club on Saturday, he said: "One of the challenges my government has taken upon itself is to try and improve connections between the States south of the Vindhyas and Iammu and Kashmir. Therefore, we hope that in the future, more people from this part of the country visit to I&K for film shoots and vacations."

Answering questions pertaining to the aftermath of Operation Sindoor, Mr. Abdullah said: "We conducted a comprehensive security audit of all our tourist destinations. Some of them, even at this moment, are not open for tourism activity. However, most places have reo-

pened, and we are taking all necessary precautions."

He said: "There is no gap or difference between the National Conference and the INDIA bloc. We continue to remain a part of it."

On the Prime Minister's visit to Manipur, Mr. Abdullah said: "I think it is a good thing. There has been a lot of commentary about the fact that Prime Minister Modi has avoided travelling to that part of the country, particularly after the violence that broke out in 2023. Better late than never...We hope that peace and calm are restored, and that the differences between the two

tribal communities are reduced to the point where people are able to live their lives normally."

Speaking about the India versus Pakistan cricket match on Sunday, Mr. Abdullah said: "Our problem has always been bilateral cricket matches. I do not think we have ever had a problem with multilateral ones, being part of large tournaments. If I understand correctly, this game is part of a tournament. It is not part of a bilateral series between the two countries. If this is a start and things can go in a positive trajectory from there, nothing like it. Very often, sport becomes a victim to politics. And nowhere is this more true than with cricket and the subcontinent. But you can't wish away what happens. My part of the country has been the direct victim of this – more than 35 years of trouble. And this year, we all saw what happened in Pahalgam. These are real concerns that we have. And you can't wish them away."

Statehood promise

Stressing the need for Statehood for Jammu and Kashmir, Mr. Abdullah said: "Law and order, policing: these are all responsibilities of elected governments. **Jammu** Kashmir has been promised full Statehood by the Prime Minister, the Home Minister, and other representatives of the Government of India when this matter was being argued before the Supreme Court. So there is no reason why this promise should not be kept. Again, this is something that should have already happened. We believe that this promise must be honoured, and the elected government must be empowered in the way the people wanted it to be."

Omar Abdullah: Most J&K tourist spots reopened, Statehood promise must be honoured English:

J&K CM Omar Abdullah said most tourist destinations have reopened with security audits post-Operation Sindoor. He stressed the need to restore statehood, arguing law and order must be under elected governments. He also commented on India-Pakistan cricket matches, saying bilateral ones are problematic.

Won't concede even a drop of Telangana's allocated water: CM

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy stressed that Telangana was entitled to 904 TMC ft of Krishna waters under equitable distribution, and Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, will personally represent the State at the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal final arguments in New Delhi on September 23, 24 and 25.

Chairing a high-level review meeting on Saturday, the Chief Minister said Telangana would not concede "even a drop" of its allocated waters, whether net, surplus, or flood flows.

Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, senior counsel C.S. Vaidyanathan, former Central Water Commission Chairman K. Vohra, irrigation advisor Adityanath Das, Irrigation Chief Secretary Rahul Bojja, ENC Anjad Hussain, and senior officials participated in the review.

The Chief Minister instructed legal experts to place before the Tribunal detailed records of all projects taken up, proposed, or left incomplete in the united Andhra Pradesh era, along with relevant GOs, memos and official documents. "For decades, Telangana suffered injustice in Krishna allocations. This is our opportunity to rectify the wrongs and secure every drop due to us," he said.

Officials briefed the Chief Minister that the previous government had agreed to just 299 TMC for Telangana, effectively surrendering 512 TMC to Andhra Pradesh, a position now cited by A.P. before the Tribunal.

'Unforgivable betrayal'

Mr. Revanth Reddy condemned former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao for what he called "an unforgivable betrayal," accusing the BRS regime of keeping in limbo key irrigation projects like Palamuru-Rangareddy lift scheme and Dindi.

The Chief Minister further alleged that Andhra Pradesh was illegally diverting Krishna waters even before the Srisailam reservoir reached full level, releasing up to 10 TMC ft per day through Pothireddypadu and the Rayalaseema Lift Scheme. The water is being transferred to other basins via Pattiseema, Pulichintala and Chintalapadu canals. "Such diare crippling versions hydropower generation at Srisailam, Nagarjunasagar and Pulichintala," he said.

Telangana asserts right to Krishna waters English:

CM Revanth Reddy said Telangana is entitled to 904 TMC ft of Krishna river water and will not concede "a drop". He accused Andhra Pradesh of illegal diversion and blamed the previous BRS government for compromising Telangana's rights. Final arguments before Krishna Water Tribunal are scheduled for September 23–25.

Northeast suffered heavily from vote bank politics, but is now a growth engine: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said the northeastern region had earlier suffered heavily from "vote bank" politics, but was now being transformed into the country's growth engine by the efforts of the BJP-led government at the Centre.

During his second visit to Mizoram after 2014, Mr. Modi launched projects estimated at ₹9,000 crore, and addressed a public rally virtually from the Lengpui airport near Aizawl as he could not reach the venue, Lammual Ground in the heart of the city, owing to heavy rain.

Mr. Modi flagged off a new Rajdhani Express between Aizawl and Delhi and other strategic projects to augment rail, highway, energy, and sports infrastructure.

"For a long time, some political parties in our country practised votebank politics. Their focus was always on places that had more votes and seats. The entire northeast, including States such s Mizoram, suffered greatly because of this attitude. But our approach is very different – those who were ear-

lier neglected are at the forefront now. Those who were once marginalised are now in the mainstream. For the past 11 years, we have been working for the development of the Northeast, and the region is becoming the growth engine of India," he said.

He said Mizoram played a major role in the Centre's "Act East" policy, and the Kaladan multimodal transit project and railway lines would connect the state with Southeast Asia.

Unveiling the ₹8,070crore Bairabi-Sairang line, which integrated landlocked Mizoram fully with the country's railway network, the Prime Minister said it was a historic day for the State as the 51.38km stretch would connect the State capital, Aizawl, with major metropolises.

He said the project, which was implemented by overcoming various challenges and difficult terrains, would revolutionise people's lives in the State and become a lifeline for transportation.

He flagged off three new express trains connecting Aizawl with Delhi, Guwahati, and Kolkata.

"This is not just a railway connection, it is a lifeline of transformation. Farmers and businesses of Mizoram can reach more markets across the nation. People will be able to access more options for education and healthcare. This will also create employment opportunities in tourism, transport and hospitality sectors," he said.

Modi inaugurates Mizoram rail link; says Northeast now growth engine English:

PM Modi inaugurated the ₹8,070-crore Bairabi-Sairang railway line in Mizoram, connecting the state with India's national network.
